Ofsted (September 2017) recognised an improvement in the attendance of our PPG children ...
 <p>Child First</p>	£7,272	Faster access to family support worker, speech & language therapist and direct access to mental health services.	Families who have received this support were more engaged with school, the children's attendance improved and the level of support they are receiving within and out of school had a positive impact on their ability to learn and their emotional well-being/mental health. We hope this will continue to lead to better academic outcomes for these pupils.

	£4,500	Personalised tuition to accelerate the progress and attainment of pupils in Years 2 to 6.	Although children enjoyed attending Learning Academies and we saw some improvements at the end of KS1 and KS2 data for the children it was not a greater improvement than in-school interventions. Therefore, this will continue until the end of Autumn term and after school only as we were under contract.
Play Therapist 	£5426	Better engagement in childcare & learning. Removal of barriers resulting from experiences out of school	A small proportion of PPG children accessed this service. Many positive outcomes have been identified including: a raise in self-esteem, behaviour and improving strategies to regulate own behaviour and deal with our emotion. This provision will continue to support our PPG pupils' emotional wellbeing this year, and in turn will improve their academic achievement.
Extended Services  School Journey Assistance 	£1,162 £780	Subsidising the costs of our before & after school care to support parents of PPG pupils who are at work. Subsidising the cost of our annual school journey which is an enhanced learning experience at a superb residential educational activity centre.	As part of our attendance package, to enable parents to improve attendance children are offered pre and after school care. This has helped our attendance figures improve and ensured pupils are ready each morning for school. Residential journeys benefit the 'whole child' and provide them with unique learning experiences which boost self-esteem as well as confidence and social skills. Essex Outdoors stresses that 'Outdoor education plays a vital part the development of children's personal, social and physical skills.
Thrive Staff, Interventions, Classroom support & PPG responsibility	£70,000	Additional hours of support specifically for PP children through either the classroom setting or interventions & the nurture group setting.	A proportion of our PPG pupils have barriers to learning stemming from their emotional wellbeing. Thrive Approach is a way of working with children and that supports the optimal development of their brains and nervous systems. Furthermore, where the nature of children's early experiences mean that they have not developed a good enough stress-

The approach is based on Neuroscience and local schools that we have visited have experienced great success with their PPG pupils.</p> <p>A large proportion of pupils who received individualised interventions in 2016-17 made accelerated progress in Reading, Writing, Maths or Phonics and the difference between the academic outcomes of them and their peers began to diminish.</p>
