IMPORTANT – Punctuality Expectations

Punctuality is vital to the start of the school day as the day's objectives are set and learning tasks explained. Lateness also causes disruption for the rest of the class who are ready to learn.

- ♦ **The school gates are opened at 8.40am & locked at 8.55a**
- ♦ **The register is taken at 9am promptly.**
- ♦ **Lateness forms part of our regular Attendance Reviews conducted in conjunction with attendance officers from Attendance Solutions.**
- ♦ **Parents have a legal obligation to ensure that their children arrive at school punctually each day.**

Failure to address and improve on punctuality issues raised will, in the first instance; result in a request to attend a School Attendance Meeting here at school. Continued failure to address poor punctuality may then result in a fine being sought via Essex Country Councils 'Missing Education & Child Employment Service'.

Term Time Holidays

Term times are for education, pupils and families have 175 days off school, including weekends and school holidays, to spend time together. Taking children out of school during term time can be detrimental to children's educational progress. There is no entitlement to parents to take their children out of school during term time.

The school will only authorise a term time holiday in genuinely exceptional circumstance. Where an unauthorised holiday is taken, the school will request that a penalty notice be issued to each parent of £60* for each child taken out of school.

*Increasing to £120 if not paid within 21 days.
